Welcome and Introductions

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. with a welcome by Lori Solitro, Community Development Manager City of Deltona. Carrie Baird, Executive Director of One Voice for Volusia welcomed participants followed by self introductions. Carrie explained the role of One Voice for Volusia as our local coalition coordinating the grant and provided a handout on the agency.

Deltona Prevention Project overview

David Kerr provided background on the Strategic Prevention Framework and the data elements that led to the project, to address underage drinking, being established in The City of Deltona. Handouts provided.

Action Plan

Carrie and David led a discussion about the Strategy Action Plan and the steps involved. The Action Plan was provided to all participants.

Collaborative Development

The Project's membership spreadsheet/email directory was passed around for each participant to review and fill in any missing information. The "Community Connector" was discussed as a tool to help agencies with sharing information e.g., training, vacancies, program announcements, etc. A handout was provided to inform participants about how to access the Community Connector service provided through One Voice for Volusia. Several examples of potential collaborative opportunities were handed out and discussed, including the Florida Afterschool Network self assessment guide, Lights on Afterschool event and the After the School Bell Rings television presentation jointly scheduled for October 16th.

Assess Capacities

Carrie provided an in depth review of the responses to the Self Assessment Survey conducted in July, providing three (3) handouts breaking down the findings. The findings generated discussion on how the Prevention Project could be best utilized for the collaborative members.

Training and Technical Assistance

A brainstorming session provided input on opportunities which will be pursued for the purpose of capacity building. Training and skill enhancements for staff along with agency development opportunities were presented. A compilation of the input will be provided in another format to participants for further consideration.

Parent Campaign

Carrie provided an overview of the Parent Campaign. A signup sheet requesting involvement in an ad hoc committee to provide further input on the campaign was handed out and seven (7) participants representing (5) agencies volunteered to participate.

Next Steps

Lori Solitro advised participants that The City of Deltona will be opening soon a Social Services Center with a ribbon cutting event scheduled for September 23rd at 3:30 p.m. Also, the City's annual Social Services Summit will be held on November 18th at 3:30 p.m. at the City's Commission Chambers.

The next meeting date for the Deltona Prevention Project is being targeted for the middle of October and dates will be provided upon verifying the availability of the Commission Chambers. Participants were asked to complete the meeting critique forms.

The meeting was adjourned at approximately 11:30 a.m. with participants taking the opportunity to network.

Welcome and Introductions

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. with a welcome by Ms. Baird. Roundtable introductions ensued and Ms. Baird introduced Ms. Schlageter as the new project coordinator.

Project Business

Ms. Schlageter reviewed the meeting schedule, announcing that November 11th is Veterans' Day. Discussion ensued and consensus was reached to not meet in November but keep the proposed December through March meeting schedule, meeting from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. in the City Commission Chambers in the City of Deltona. She directed attendees to the Member Directory, requesting any changes be reflected to the master copy.

Training Resources & Samples

Ms. Schlageter led attendees through an e-polling exercise using hand-held clickers intended to capture member responses from a survey. The exercise, which was comprised of 15 questions related to trainings and other resources of interest to the group, resulted in the following:

- No interest in establishing customized workshops, but interest in the other Search Institute trainings.
- Interest in receiving resources such as posters and other "giveaway" (bookmarks, etc.) items instead of books and manuals.
- Interest in Community Engagement and Staff Development as the priorities, then Program Development and Organizational Development.

Ms. Baird opened the discussion for a brainstorming session regarding other training activities of interest to the group. Feedback included:

- Frequency of trainings should be conducted quarterly with "Lunch & Learns" in between and/or as requested. Local issues to include/consider:
- Gender identity with special attention/focus to the middle school age parents (coming to school and working with staff)

Bullying issues and tolerance of others to also include cyber-bullying and how bullying can lead to gang involvement, activity, educate adults on how to teach youth to handle

- Create/enhance access to referrals and community resources, available to assist/serve.
- Build from developmental assets

- Look into the “Culture of Poverty” trainings (recommended training coordinated by one of the Child Abuse & Neglect Prevention planning teams years ago)
- Intentionally invite other agencies certified through SAMHSA, gain program/training/lot of three trainings through state
- Co-occurring agencies
- Dating violence is becoming a growing problem
- How to be compassionate to/for youth.
- Youth Leadership, involving Youth as the Leaders/Trainers
- In that spirituality can be overlooked in the prevention framework, it was suggested to work with area churches to build that piece into some sort of training

- Volusia County has 466 documented members of local gangs; 228 associates
- Number of street gangs with documented activity is down
- There are 4 gang members per 1,000 people in the state of Florida
- Types of crimes
- Why kids get involved in gangs

- Rappers in gangs (whether active or not) serve as role models
- 15% of gang members are female
