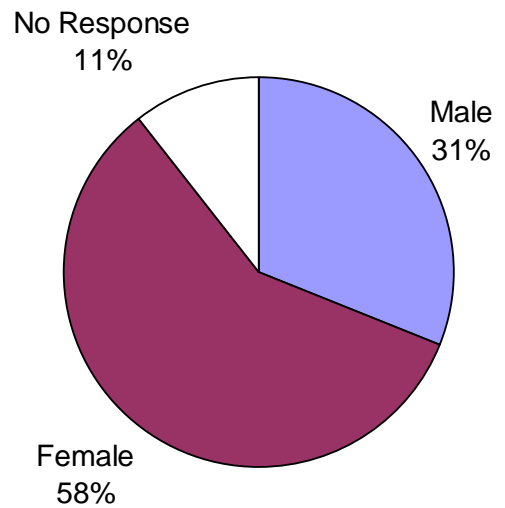


# Community Agenda Workgroup Demographics

## Basics:

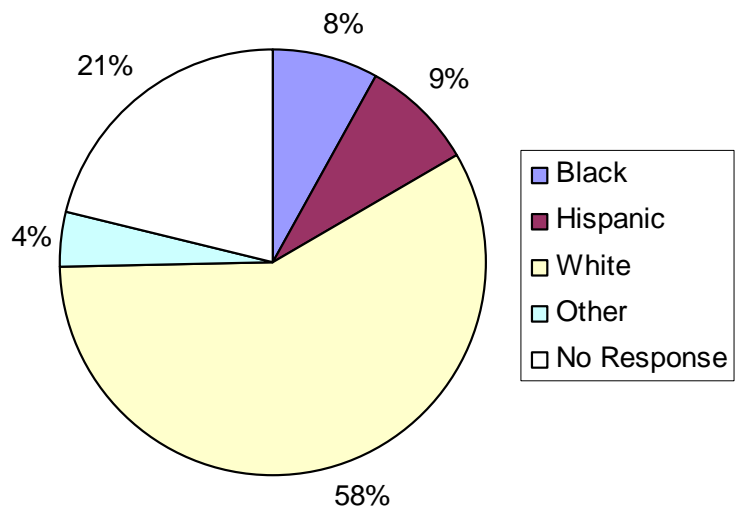
- 151 individuals participated in the five workgroups (there were some individuals who participated in multiple workgroups, so their demographic information is duplicative)

**Gender of All Workgroup Participants**

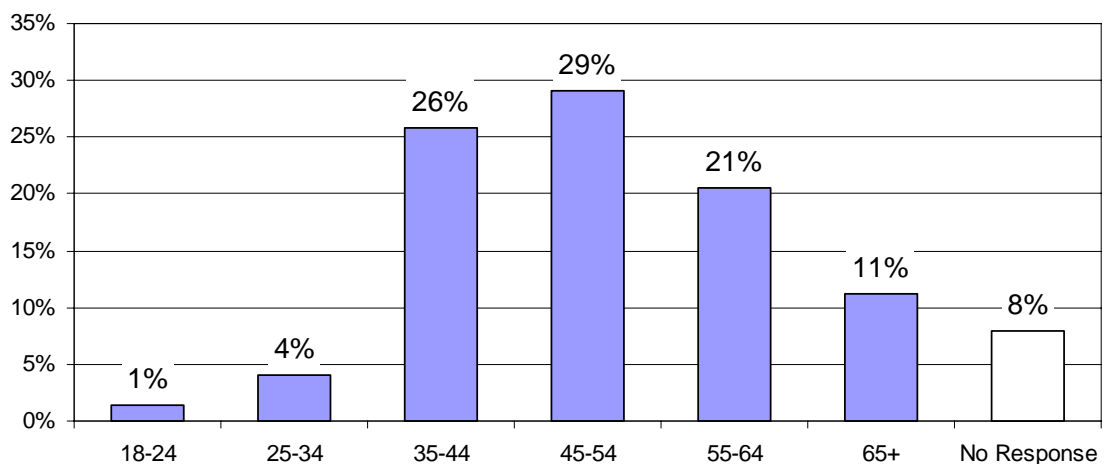

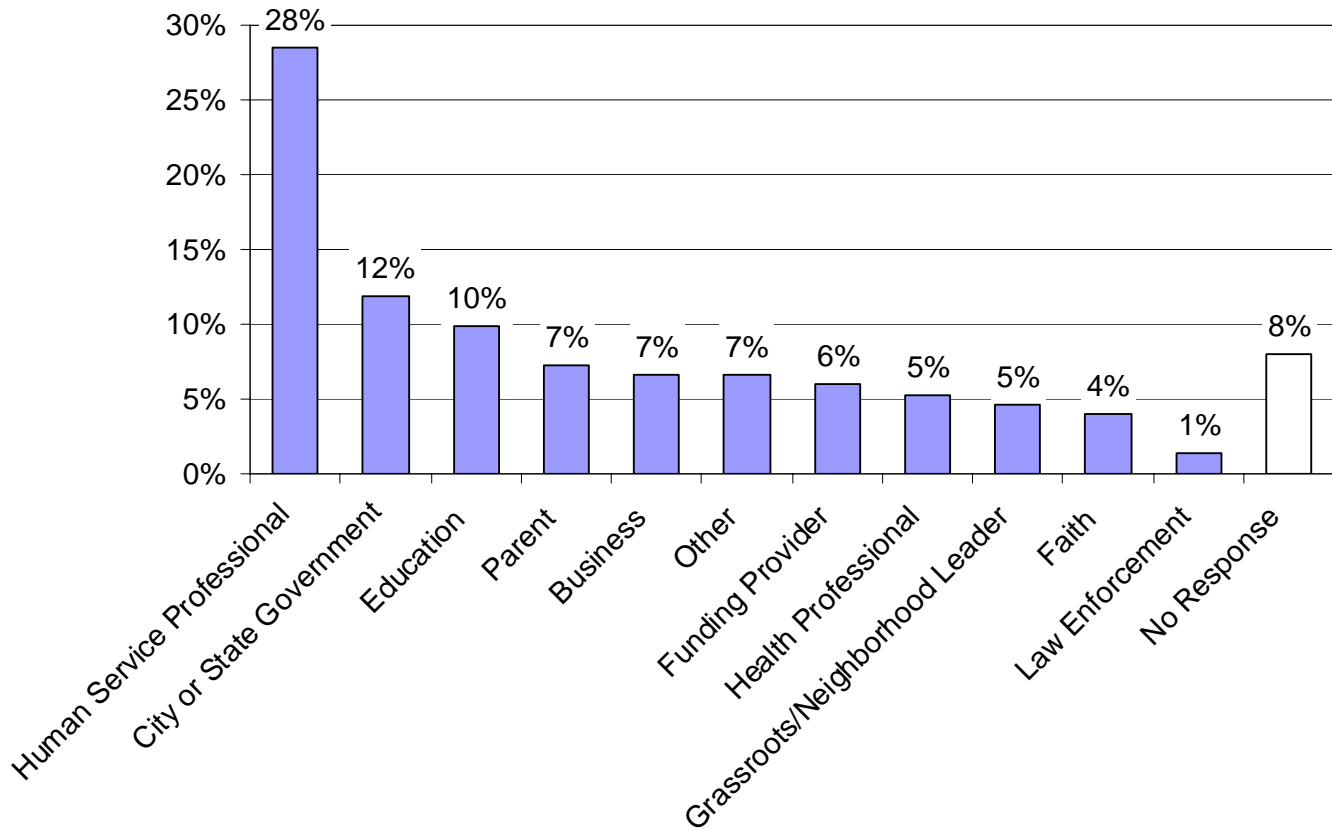
**Race & Ethnicity of All Workgroup Participants**
